## Agenda Items

- Chair Loo opened the special meeting to provide background on why the special meeting
  was called to address the new grant process and the delays in the release of funds, as well
  as setting expectations for next grant funding years.
- Grants Process FY2017
  - All applicants are required to apply online via the Zoom System
  - Performance requirement to attend 10 MOAPIA events has been removed because it was not stipulated in the original RFA.
  - OAA, OLA, and MOAPIA has now streamlined the process. A grant facilitator was hired and MOAPIA's paperwork submitted to the facilitator who had no problems with what was being submitted
  - FY2016 Timeline -- Previous years, RFA was released in August, but was released two months late and grantees were announced in January. First release of funds will likely be on March 7<sup>th</sup> (covering 2 fiscal quarters) and then two subsequent releases after that. MOAPIA is in the PO process at this time.

## Priorities for Grants

- Discussion regarding funding priorities were mentioned. 15 organizations submitted an application that covered \$600,000. MOAPIA decided to distribute \$213,000 among the 8 organizations. MOCA approved Director Do's recommendations. Funding was provided to two organizations APALRC and Housing Counseling Services concerning affordable housing issues. AALEAD funding was less than this year, with an increase in funding for health initiatives HBI-DC and CSC (language access). Multi-year funding was asked and Director Do said that this cannot be done because funding levels change every year, priorities change and grants are not guaranteed. Question concerning reporting Dory Peters will follow-up with grantees on the reporting/grant monitoring process.
- Communications Structure for MOAPIA and MOCA There is a need to establish open-lines
  of communication between MOAPIA and grantees. Chair Loo encourages grantees to also
  reach out to the Commission.
