## February 25, 2011

The meeting started with the discussion on the Oversight Hearing coming up this Monday, Feb. 28<sup>th</sup>, 2011. Julie reported that she is taking care of community testimonies. Wylie mentioned doing something in Ward 5 where the Yes Organic (Korean owned) grocery store is. John mentioned doing something with youth and Anacostia High School and youth in that area where there will be educational and cultural dialogue.

May Heritage nomination letters and forms were reviewed and edited accordingly. Nomination letters will be sent out first week in March and nomination due date is Thurs. April 7<sup>th</sup>. Some

ideas for this year's May Heritage month were to involve more youth and youth dance groups like Silk Road and Sahara.
