A Message from the Director

Dear Community Members,

Yesterday, President Trump announced that he plans to end the Deferred Action for Childhood Arrivals (DACA) program. Following his announcement, Mayor Bowser immediately released a <u>statement</u> reaffirming the District's support for DACA and urging Congress to quickly pass the Dream Act so that DREAMers across our country can continue to build a safer, stronger and more prosperous country for all.

I want to assure you that the Bowser Administration's support for DREAMers and immigrants of all ages and backgrounds who live in the District remains strong and unwavering. In the coming weeks, we will grant up to



\$500,000 to organizations that provide legal services for DC's immigrant community. The Immigrant Justice Legal Services grant program is intended to help DC residents apply for green cards; convert green cards to citizenship; renew DACA applications and work permits for DC residents, conduct Know Your Rights briefings and workshops and much more.

Through this program, we will continue to protect and advance the DC Values that have made Washington, DC one of the best places to live, work and thrive.

MOAPIA Outreach




Twice a week, MOAPIA's outreach team visits businesses across the District to offer information about government programs and resources. Resources are provided in the



New Minimum Wage



Effective July 1, 2017, the minimum wage is \$12.50 per hour for employees that do not receive tips and \$3.33 per hour for tipped employees.

Private Security Camera Incentive Program

The Office of Victim Services and Justice Grants (OVSJG) wants residents to improve public safety by participating in the Private Security Camera Incentive Program.

The program provides a rebate of up to \$200 per camera, with a maximum rebate of up to \$500 per residential address and \$750 for all other addresses.
